



Dr. Carlos A. Fasciolo

Born in 1943, Carlos A. Fasciolo studied Economics at the University of Buenos Aires, Argentina, and at The American University, Washington, DC. He is Ph.D in International Relations and Master of Science in Economics at the Pacific Western University, Los Angeles, California. He followed several courses on foreign trade.

He is Minister to the Foreign Service of Argentina, and Deputy Ambassador at the Argentine Embassy in Seoul, Korea, since April 2001.

He was member of the Argentine trade delegation at the former Latin American Free Trade Association, LAFTA, (Montevideo, Uruguay) in 1967 and 1968, and acted at the head of the Economic and Trade Offices of the Argentine Embassies in the United States (Washington DC.) from 1971 to 1978, in West Africa (Lagos, Nigeria) in 1980 and 1981, in Brazil (Brasilia DF.) from 1981 to 1988, in Chile (Santiago) from 1992 to 1994, and General Consul in Rio de Janeiro (Brazil) from 1994 to 1997.

He was Under Director of Trade Promotion at the Ministry of Economy and Director of Foreign Trade at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Argentina. He was member of the Argentine Council for International Relations (CARI) in Buenos Aires (1999-2001) and member of the International Research Center

for Development (CEID - www.ceid.edu.ar), in Buenos Aires, Argentina, since 1998.

He has lectured on specialized subjects. He is continuously written several articles for different publications in foreign newspapers and magazines.

He was also professor at the Organization of the American States, Belgrano University, Bank of Boston Foundation and other learning institutions in

Buenos Aires, Argentina, Universidade Estacio de Sa and UniverCidade in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
